The Allied Arts Council of St. **Joseph, Missouri** exists "to bring arts and people together." Founded in 1963, the Council is one of the oldest in the State of Missouri and is acknowledged statewide as an arts leader. In 1990, the City of St. Joseph designated the Allied Arts Council as the City's official community arts agency. Operating with a staff of four and a volunteer base approaching 2,000, the Council takes the lead in our community in organizing, fundraising, advocating, educating, and servicing the local arts community.

Organizational membership in the

Council is open to nonprofit agencies who provide arts related activities. Currently fifteen arts and cultural agencies are members. As an umbrella agency, the Council assists with scheduling, funding, and marketing for all member agencies. The Council is also working with the City of St. Joseph to increase marketing for the major performing arts center in the city, the Missouri Theater.

The Council provides educational programs, art exhibits, and summer youth arts programs, as well as operating the annual Trails West!® arts festival.

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Allied Arts Council to participate in national research study

The Arts Mean Business. The Allied arts organizations to collect surveys Arts Council has joined the Arts & Economic Prosperity© 5, a national study measuring the economic impact of nonprofit arts and culture organizations and their audiences. The research study is being conducted by Americans for the Arts, the nation's nonprofit organization advancing the arts and arts education.

As one of nearly 300 study partners across all 50 states plus the District of Columbia, the Allied Arts Council will collect detailed economic data from nonprofit arts and culture organizations located throughout the area. In addition, Allied Arts Council will col-

from arts and culture attendees during 2016. The results of the study will be released in June of 2017.

"Many people don't think of nonprofit arts organizations as businesses," said Robert Dempster, "but this study will make clear that the arts are a formidable industry in our community-employing people locally, purchasing goods and services from local merchants, and helping to drive tourism and economic development."

This will be the Allied Arts Council's third time to participate in the national study, which measures the imlaborate with the community's other pact of arts spending on local jobs,

Artcetera, a local art studio, lounge, gallery and retail shop, also offers the option to bring your own beverages/wine and snacks. Since the early 1980's, literally thousands of local and regional children have developed life-long memories being a part of Missoula Children's Theatre. This incredible program, presented by Performing Arts Association, has not only introduced many children to their first taste of performance arts, but has taught them life skills and confidence that they can transfer into other areas of their life.

Missoula Children's Theatre fosters creativity and enhances innate capabilities in individuals all over the season, world by providing access to com- so munity-driven performing arts expe- thousands riences. It is the nation's largest tour- of ing children's theatre and has been touring extensively for more than 40 years. Each year, a Missoula tour team arrives in a given town with a set, lights, costumes, props and make-up, everything it takes to put on a play...except the cast. The team holds an open audition and casts 50-60 local students to perform in the production. The show is rehearsed throughout the week and two public performances are presented on Saturday.

The experience begins with an open

ternoon. The auditions last two full hours. Each child who attends the audition will need to be present for the entire two hours. Throughout the following week, children work not only on the musical itself, but also learn creativity, social skills, goal achievement, communication skills and self-esteem. And at the end of the short 5 days they're ready to perform their hard work for family and friends.
